# Submission of Entries 2018 Fraser Valley Invitational

The *Langley Camera Club* will once again hold the **Fraser Valley Invitational**, a digital competition. The theme for the competition is "Connections - relationships in which a person, thing or idea is linked with something else."

The event will take place on **Saturday, May 12th** at the Calyton Heights Secondary School, 7003 – 188 Street, Surrey. Doors open at 6:30 with the show commencing at 7:30 pm. Tickets are available at the club's web site:

The cost is \$18 online or \$20 at the door.

Our club can submit a minimum of four (4) up to a maximum of ten (10) club entries, with no more than one (1) entry per club member. If a photographer is a member of multiple clubs, only one entry, through one club.

- Members can submit up to two (2) images for consideration.
- Any photograph that has been previously sent to a Fraser Valley Invitational competition may not be re-submitted.
- Images should be titled as follows: Photographer-Name\_TITLE.jpg
- The title of the photograph should be limited to five words or less. Use spaces between the photographer's name and the words of the title. For example: Nick Nikon - My Winning Photograph.jpg
- The file is to be submitted in JPG format, using the **sRGB Colour Profile**.
- Files sizes should be a **maximum of 1400 pixels in width and 1050 pixels in height**.
- Upload submissions via the Club's Drop Box. Link is on the web site: **Submissions must be upload by Saturday March 24th, 2018.**



## Judging Process

- All photographs are to adhere to the realm of Connections - *relationships in which a person, thing or idea is linked with something else.*
- Composites, post processing and enhancements are encouraged as long as the integrity of the photograph(s) is present and has originated with the photographer.
- The photograph may be in colour, monochromatic or a combination thereof.

A selection committee will review submissions and selected images will be shown at one of the NWPC Meetings in April.
