For photo ops, October is a fantastic month for fall colour. If it's cloudy, a polarizing filter helps to get rid of the reflections on leaves. If it's sunny, backlit colours can be stunning. Try to simplify your compositions. The Fraser Valley backroads can provide great colour, fences and barns. Towards Abbotsford, or around the intersection of Hwy 10 and Fraser Hwy, morning fog sometimes settles. Worth a drive if the day is clear and the nights are cold. Cultus Lake has great colour and the option for lake reflections. Even your local park can provide interesting moody shots. From now until December, shadows are long and light is interesting. Take advantage.
