## **Worth Seeing**

From January 29 to May 26, the Vancouver Art Gallery will exhibit "Real Pictures: Photographs from the Collection of Claudia Beck and Andrew Gruft". According to CBC News, the \$2-million photo collection (463 works), partly gifted to and partly purchased by the gallery, was assembled by Claudia Beck and Andrew Gruft, who have been photographic curators, dealers and collectors in Vancouver since the 1970s. Gallery Director Kathleen Bartels indicates that with this addition to its collection, the Vancouver Art Gallery's photographic collection is now one of the most significant in North America and in the same league as that of the National Gallery in Ottawa. The collection includes work from 155 photographers, from rare images from the earliest days of photography through to more current images. Over 300 photographs from the recently acquired collection will be included in the exhibit.

## **BC Print Challenge**

We don't have the rules yet, but the March 1 print night is the date we have scheduled to select our entries. (Last year, entries were due Mar 28). Here is an excerpt from last year's rules:

- 1. Club entry shall be a maximum of 10 prints. Only one print from any photographer will be accepted.
- 2. Prints may be B/W or color. Subjects are the choice of the photographer.
- 3. Minimum print size: 80 square inches. Maximum 16" x 20".
- 4. Outside dimensions of the mat and backing must be 16" x 20".

Anything larger will not be accepted. **No foam core** mounting, please.

- 5. All prints should be matted and the matting firmly attached to the back mounting in order to survive frequent handling during the following year.

  Only single, white window mats will be accepted. Prints cannot be framed.
- 6. All entries must indicate on the right top corner on the back of the print:

  Title

Photographer's name and address Club name

Club address

- 7. Photographer's name cannot appear on the front of the print.
- 8. Prints previously entered in the Pacific Zone Print Challenge are ineligible.
- 9. Only prints that are permitted to circulate during the following 12 months can be accepted and judged.

## **North Shore Challenge**

The North Shore Challenge, a slide competition open to BC clubs, will be held March 5, 2005 in a new venue in West Vancouver and tickets will be \$12.

This year, all images will be **projected digitally** using a high-end projector.
