

See, Score & Discuss

Our next In-House Digital Competition will be an event that involves the entire membership and provide insight into what moves us when we view a photograph.

Members can submit one image for the in-house competition by uploading the file to the Club's Drop Box **account no later than Friday, November 24th 11:00 pm.**

- Images are to be in sRGB colour mode and in .jpg file format.
- The maximum height of the file is limited to 1080 pixels, horizontal files can be up to 1920 pixels wide, but check that you do not exceed the maximum height of 1080 files. The system will prevent you from uploading the oversized file.
- Title the image as follows: Name-Title.jpg (images when shown will not include the photographer's name).

At the November 28th meeting members will be provided a scoring sheet. We will follow the CAPA scoring guidelines.

Acknowledge that as photographers, we all have some preferences as to the type of photography we like the most. Put those preferences aside. See and score the photograph. Add some comments on the high scores.

As a "judge" you are not applying rules of photography, such as the rule of thirds, but rather assessing the photography in terms of its composition, message and impact on you as a viewer. The right composition is the composition that works for the image.

Photographs are scored out of a point total of 9.

- 1, 2 or 3 -Extremely poor, serious faults
- 4, 5 - Fair possible minor faults
- 6, 7 - Good photograph
- 8 - Excellent photograph
- 9 – Exceptional

There will be room on the scoring sheet to record a comment on any score of 7 or higher. That means you thought it was very good. A professional critique is not expected. But we see different things about a photograph, so you are encouraged to include at least one thing that made the image a success for you. We will all learn by the comments shared. By hearing from each other what aspect of the photograph moved us to use a score of 7 or more we will all come away with greater insight. Not only about our own photograph, but also about all the images shown.

The call to action. Submit an image. Come to the meeting with an open mind. Bring a pen or pencil. Let's make this a great learning experience.
